



IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT



NEW PROTOCOLS ORDERED BY THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

ANY STUDENT WHO PRESENTS AT SCHOOL WITH COVID-19 SYMPTOMS MUST BE TESTED FOR COVID-19 AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

- All students determined to be close contacts must move to remote learning until the symptomatic child's test results are available.
- If the symptomatic child tests positive, all those determined to be close contacts must remain in remote learning mode for a full 14 days from the date of last contact with the symptomatic child.

If the symptomatic child tests negative, all those determined to be close contacts may return to in-person learning.

IF A CHILD OR ANY HOUSEHOLD MEMBER IS SYMPTOMATIC OR AWAITING COVID-19 TEST RESULTS, THE CHILD MUST MOVE TO REMOTE LEARNING.

- The sick individual must then be tested and entire household must quarantine until a negative COVID-19 test result is available. A negative test from the symptomatic individual would allow the child to be readmitted to in-person learning. *If the test result is positive, the 14-day quarantine must be completed.*

IF A CHILD OR HOUSEHOLD MEMBER IS SICK, CONTACT SCHOOL NURSE AND DIVISION HEAD BEFORE SENDING CHILD TO SCHOOL.
